gustar
(to be pleasing to)

Ana dice: --Me gusta la escuela. *I like school.*

(*School is pleasing to me.*)

--Me gusta la música de Enrique.













(*Enrique's music is pleasing to me.*)

In English you say you "I like chocolate".
In Spanish you say "Chocolate is pleasing to me".

(to me) (is pleasing)

Plural nouns after "gusta"

The expression "me gusta" changes to "me gustan" when followed by a plural noun.

me gustan
(to me) (are pleasing)









Example: Me gusta el carro nuevo. (*singular*)

Me gustan los carros nuevos. (*plural*)
