## Moon Over Manifest by Clare Vanderpool

Daily reading assignment is to read for thirty minutes or 20 pages, stopping at the chapter break nearest to the twentieth page. The following questions are mostly for guided reading to allow students to follow the most important parts of the novel in a logical fashion. Most questions are for mental direction only. Several questions are to be written out for grading, marked \* Written Assignment .\* The written answers must conform to standard English format. Points will be taken away for using YOU, not capitalizing "I," not capitalizing personal names, using contractions, improper punctuations, and for misspellings. Written answers may be posted to Mr. Nease's e-mail address: <a href="mailto:rnease@k12.wv.us">rnease@k12.wv.us</a> or with a written hard (paper) copy delivered to PPJSHS by means of bus delivery or personal delivery. When we return to the classroom, all of these questions will be asked in an oral question and answer manner.

Begin first reading:

Notice and read carefully to remember the characters on pages vii & viii.

\*Written Assignment \* (Determine on page 1.) Is this novel written as a first person narration or as a third person narration? How do you know? <u>Answer these questions with complete sentences.</u>

Comments, questions for thought and guided reading:

Name the father.

Name the narrator.

Is there a real town in the Southeast corner of Kansas named Manifest? Search for the answer on pages 343 & 344.

What did the main character have from Manifest dated 1917, that gave her some knowledge about the town?

What was her most prized possession, that her father had given to her?

What was written on that possession? p. 2

Definition - wrought - past tense for wright (someone who makes things) - twisted, formed or made by the efforts of an ironwright.

Perdition - p.9 - place of ruin or place of ruined souls

Whom did she meet and what did he return to her?

Time/Setting 1936, the Great Depression - 15,000,000 men were unable to find employment, one of every four men in the United States.

Who was Hattie Mae?

Consider well the first descriptions of Shady and Hattie Mae. Physically, how should each be remembered and described? Emotionally, how would you describe each. Notice, p. 14, Hattie Mae's description. Do you imagine that you also know someone that hugs and greets by saying, "aren't you a darling," . . . "you look just like your (father/mother)"?

Hattie Mae started that news column when she graduated from high school in 1917. The year for Abilene was 1936. How old would that make Hattie Mae in 1936?
